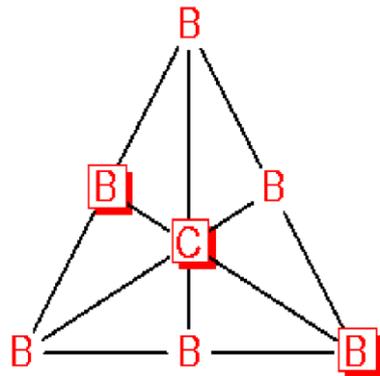


# British Combinatorial Bulletin 2017
